

<u>Present:</u> Pastor Bryan Anderson, Aaron Buhr, Jackie Goodmanson, Neil Larson, Kevin Kamm, Bill McIntire, Liane Petersen, Becky Schramski, and Dan Cain.

Meeting called to order by Neil Larson. Pastor led in prayer.

<u>Reports:</u> (Secretary, Budget, Pastor)- Aaron Buhr made motion to approve meeting minutes, Liane seconded, motion unanimously approved. Bill made motion to approve Budget and Pastor's Report, Aaron seconded, motion unanimously approved.

Committee Reports

Education- Emily Larson and Tiffany Wagner will work with Patti Wyss to assume a joint position for Sunday School Superintendent. Education Committee meetings will begin after Easter to plan for the transition.

Finance- \$11,000 was donated towards an outside sign by the Shirley Warner-Buhr Family. Decorating committee will meet to discuss sign options. They have met in the past and have some of the ideas but were waiting for more funds to become available. Liane will bring options back to the Council. A possible campaign for signage may be needed because signs are very expensive. There are rules and city ordinances that must be followed. We will table the discussion until more information is gathered. Another donation of \$25,000 was given to apply to the mortgage principle from LaMoyne & Renee Emerson. Thank you cards will be signed by the Council to thank the families for their gifts.

Property- The basketball hoop on the playground is broke and the Council will search for a replacement. Neil Larson may have a lead on this. The insurance company is asking for a tentative date for the painting job to be started. A work punch list will be created by the Property Committee and members will be invited to help complete these tasks. We will continue to use the sign-up sheet for lawn mowing. Dan will decrease the mowing area and add it to the pollinator field. A 60-inch TV is being donated to the church and the Council has decided to install that in the youth room. A motion to rescind the fee for Julie to clean after a visitation was made by Aaron and seconded Neil, motion carried unanimously. Dave Scheurmann has agreed to clean up, so the families won't have to pay anything beyond regular cleaning.

Outreach- Feed my Starving Children positions are full. There is a recruitment day for Head Start set for May 2nd.

Youth- The Kayak day for youth and families will occur if enough interest is generated.

Old Business:

A. There is an open position on the Council, as Kristin LaBeree has resigned. Council will fill after summer.

New Business:

- A. VBS- Dan Pearson & Josh Williamson have stated they will not be participating in the VBS but will let their members decide for themselves if they want to participate.
- B. Mary Porter will head the Rummage Sale for the church. People can start bringing items after May 4th.
- C. The Council would like attendance totals for only the summer months to make an informed decision regarding another Summer of Unity.
- D. Council felt that with monetary donations there should be a THANK YOU to those people. Terri will purchase thank you cards, and Council will sign them as needed.
