

Grandma Chris's Summer Salad

2- 7 oz. packages of the smallest Ring Macaroni Noodles (boil & cool)
1/4 -1/2 cup finely chopped onions
2 cups cucumbers (unpeeled and diced)
2 cups finely chopped carrots
(Optional: 2 cups of cut up celery. I do not add celery to mine)

Dressing: 1 1/2 cups Mayo 1 cup sugar 1/2 cup white vinegar 1 tsp salt 1 tsp black pepper

Can make the day ahead. Keep refrigerated until ready to serve. With the vinegar-based dressing, the salad does keep well for several days in the fridge.

FIRST LUTHERAN CHURCH Council Meeting Minutes May 19, 2025

<u>Present:</u> Pastor Bryan Anderson, Aaron Buhr, Jackie Goodmanson, Neil Larson, Kevin Kamm, Bill McIntire, Liane Petersen, Becky Schramski, Anna Buhr, Hannah Eckwall, and Dan Cain.

Meeting called to order by Neil Larson. Pastor led in prayer.

Reports: (Secretary, Budget, Pastor)

Correction to April meeting minutes: Strike words "to assume a joint position" as the Council wants it clear there is to be a single Superintendent to head up the Sunday school and they are appointing Emily Larson to that role because of her additional experience. Aaron made motion to correct April minutes, Dan seconded, and motion was carried. All other reports approved as presented.

Committee Reports

Worship- Nothing to report.

Education- Sunday School transitions meeting will start in June. VBS will be August 11-14th.

Finance- Council would like to see a report of the last 5 years giving receipts for January-May. Also, Liane mentioned that the passthrough line on the report is only for funds that are collected and paid out immediately. This should be zeroed out monthly after passthroughs are complete. Neil made a motion to remove \$50,000 out of general fund and put into a CD with the highest rate for 6 months, at an institution with the highest return rate. Becky Schramski will find best rate and work with Terri to complete. Bill seconded motion and motion was passed unanimously.

Property- Committee will meet to establish a punch list.

Outreach- Postcard outreach mailings will be updated to include a free mug/item when they come in and bring the card- Jackie made motion for this to happen, Becky seconded motion carried. Hope alive is scheduled for June 3rd in Amery. Anna Buhr will be heading it up and a sign-up list will be

set out for volunteers. We will serve ice cream in cups instead of cones. Compassion for Jesus is going well. Several child packets have been picked up. Two more weeks so a push will be made again. Baby bottle campaign is going well. Bottles have already started to come in. This goes until Father's day.

Youth- The Canoe/Kayak trip July 26th. Sign-up sheet is needed for this, and a number needs to be given to Cindy. Bill will be bringing a donated basketball hoop from a coworker and dispose of broken unit.

Old Business:

A. Summer Worship Survey- Aaron Buhr motion to continue with one service for the summer again, Becky seconded- motion was carried. The joint service will add more contemporary aspects this summer. A change from organ to piano is suggested for the summer months. The service will be at 9:00 with fellowship to follow.

New Business:

- A. Jackie made motion to make Emily Larson the Sunday School Superintendent to eliminate any confusion, Dan seconded, and motion was passed.
- B. Council decided to table the signage for now but there will be window signage put on the entry doors with our office hours and service time.
- C. June counters and communion assistants are as follows: Kevin- June 1st, Aaron- 8th, Becky- 15th, Jackie- 22nd, Liane- 29th.
- D. Dale Wirth made a proposal to mow the churches lawn for \$75.00 per cut and Terry Monson agreed to be his sub when Dale cannot make it. Aaron made motion to accept this proposal, Jackie Seconded, motion passed.
- E. Council will not meet June and July but will resume August 18th at 6:30 PM.
