Welcome and Introduction

*Call to Worship

- P: This is the day the Lord has made,
- C: let us rejoice and be glad. +

*Confession

Adapted from Luther's Small Catechism

- P: Beloved in the Lord, let us draw near with a true heart and confess our sins to God our Father, asking him in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to grant us forgiveness.
- C: You shall have no other gods.
- P: We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things.
- C: You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God.
- P: We should fear and love God that we do not use his name to curse, swear, lie or deceive, but call upon God's name in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks.
- C: Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.
- P: We should fear and love God that we do not despise preaching and his Word, but regard it as holy, and gladly hear and learn it.
- C: Honor your father and mother, that it may go well with you and that you may enjoy long life on the earth.
- P: We should fear and love God that we do not dishonor or anger our parents and others in authority, but honor, serve, and obey them, and give them love and respect.
- C: You shall not murder.
- P: We should fear and love God that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body, but help and befriend him in every bodily need.
- C: You shall not commit adultery.

- P: We should fear and love God that we lead a pure and decent life in words and actions, and that husband and wife love and honor each other.
- C: You shall not steal.
- P: We should fear and love God that we do not take our neighbor's money or property or get it by dishonest dealing, but help him to improve and protect his property and means of income.
- C: You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.
- P: We should fear and love God that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, or give him a bad name, but defend him, speak well of him, and take his words and actions in the kindest possible way.
- C: You shall not covet anything that belongs to your neighbor.
- P: We should fear and love God that we do not scheme to get our neighbor's inheritance or house, but do all we can to help him keep it. And we shall not entice away our neighbor's spouse, workers, or animals, but urge them to stay and do their duty.
- C: Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.
- P: God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. "He who believes and is baptized will be saved" (Mark 16:16).

C: Amen.

*Prayer of the Day (in unison)

Almighty God, through the preaching of your servants, the blessed Reformers, you caused the light of the gospel to shine forth. Grant that we may faithfully defend it against all enemies and joyfully proclaim it to the salvation of people everywhere to the glory of your holy name; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

A Lesson: Romans 3:19-28

Now we know that whatever the law says, it says to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced and the whole world held accountable to God. 20 Therefore no one will be declared righteous in his sight by observing the law; rather, through the law we become conscious of sin. 21 But now a righteousness from God, apart from law, has been made known, to which the Law and the Prophets testify. 22 This righteousness from God comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. There is no difference, 23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, 24 and are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus. 25 God presented him as a sacrifice of atonement, through faith in his blood. He did this to demonstrate his justice, because in his forbearance he had left the sins committed beforehand unpunished-- 26 he did it to demonstrate his justice at the present time, so as to be just and the one who justifies those who have faith in Jesus. 27 Where, then, is boasting? It is excluded. On what principle? On that of observing the law? No, but on that of faith. 28 For we maintain that a man is justified by faith apart from observing the law.

To the Jews who had believed him, Jesus said, "If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. 32 Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." 33 They answered him, "We are Abraham's descendants and have never been slaves of anyone. How can you say that we shall be set free?" 34 Jesus replied, "I tell you the truth, everyone who sins is a slave to sin. 35 Now a slave has no permanent place in the family, but a son belongs to it forever. 36 So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed.

Sermon

*The Lord's Prayer

Adapted from Luther's Small Catechism

P: I invite you to lift up your hearts to God and pray as Christ our Lord taught us.

C: Our Father in heaven.

P: With these words God tenderly invites us to believe that he is our true Father and that we are his true children, so that we may pray to him as boldly and confidently as dear children ask their dear father.

C: Hallowed be your name.

P: God's name is certainly holy by itself, but we pray in this petition that we too may keep it holy.

C: Your kingdom come.

P: God's kingdom certainly comes by itself even without our prayer, but we pray in this petition that it may also come to us.

C: Your will be done on earth as in heaven.

P: God's good and gracious will certainly is done without our prayer, but we pray in this petition that it may be done among us also.

C: Give us today our daily bread.

P: God surely gives daily bread without our asking, even to all the wicked, but we pray in this petition that he would lead us to realize this and to receive our daily bread with thanksgiving.

C: Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us.

P: We pray in this petition that our Father in heaven would not look upon our sins or because of them deny our prayers; so we too will forgive from the heart and gladly do good to those who sin against us.

C: Lead us not into temptation.

P: God surely tempts no one to sin, but we pray in this petition that God would guard and keep us, so that the devil, the world, and our flesh may not deceive us or lead us into false belief; and though we are tempted by them, we pray that we may overcome and win the victory.

C: But deliver us from evil.

- P: In conclusion we pray in this petition that our Father in heaven, would deliver us from every evil that threatens body and soul, property and reputation, and finally when our last hour comes, grant us a blessed end and graciously take us from this world of sorrow to himself in heaven.
- C: For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever. Amen.
- P: We can be sure that these petitions are acceptable to our Father in heaven and are heard by him, for he himself has commanded us to pray in this way and has promised to hear us. Therefore, we say, "Amen," "Yes, it shall be so."
