



Resurrection Truth

We confess it in the Apostle's Creed: "I believe...in the resurrection of the body." We sign in song, "Because He lives, I can face tomorrow, because He lives all fear is gone". We read in scriptures, "And if Christ has not been raised, then your faith is a delusion, and you are still lost in your sins" (1 Corinthians 15:17).

The Resurrection is the heart of Christianity. It's why we trust in Jesus as Savior and Lord. Take away the Resurrection and you take away our hope. And that is precisely why this belief comes under such attack by the enemies of the faith. Our culture is growing increasingly secular and antagonistic to Christianity.

We celebrate the Resurrection story on Easter. This year Easter is Sunday, April 5th. Already our critics are at work to undermine the faith at whatever opportunity they can. Every year, a few months before Easter it predictably starts. You will see a program advertised as finding out the latest explosive new evidence about what really happened to Jesus. News magazines will publish the obligatory sensationalist article complete with so-called authorities to back everything up. And these days the chat rooms, online influencers, and podcasts are ablaze with conversations.

What is your average Christian to make of all the activity. A few comments are in order as well as a final suggestion. First, no one ever attacks a dead letter. That is evidence itself that something is true when so many want to silence the story. Second, the Resurrection account has been attacked from the beginning. No Christian teaching has received a more thorough investigation from all sides and still stands solidly. Many a skeptic has been converted after an honest review of the historical evidence.

Third, the proof is in the pudding as they say. That is, you will best find out the truth of the Resurrection by living it. Live in the light of the hope it brings. Put it to the test for yourself and see if it will sustain you.

Finally, a suggestion. The earliest Christians were apologists – that is defenders of the faith. They took seriously, "Always be prepared to give

an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope you have" (1 Peter 3:15). They shared reasons a plenty and were willing to go to their deaths with confidence. It's always easier to believe in someone willing to let their throat be cut for the truth they believe.

You should make yourself aware of the rock-solid historical evidence behind the Resurrection belief. We have several good books in our church library that document the evidence. A smaller such resource will be available at Easter services: *Is Easter Unbelievable?* By Rebecca McLaughlin. In less than 60 pages she gives a compact summary. It is available free of charge online at: <https://www.thegoodbook.co.uk/is-easter-free-pdf/>

FIRST LUTHERAN CHURCH Council Meeting Minutes - March 9, 2026

Present: Pastor Bryan Anderson, Jackie Goodmanson, Neil Larson, Kevin Kamm, Liane Petersen, Anna Buhr, Laura Lieffring, Aaron Buhr, Bill McIntire, Hannah Eckwall, and Aaron Johnson.

Meeting called to order by Neil Larson. Pastor led in Prayer.

Reports: (Secretary, Budget, Pastor) Secretary and Pastor reports approved as presented. Finance report will be presented at the next council meeting.

Committee Reports

Worship- Discussion about attending some Christian Concerts. Youth Committee will consider.

Finance- Approval procedure created for use of Memorial Fund and any reimbursements. All requests will be submitted, and President will approve or deny requests. Jennifer Munson will be added to the Memorial fund account as an approved signer.

Property- Bill McIntire would like to have trees planted on the property. Laura Lieffring made a motion for Bill to purchase trees for the property not to exceed \$2,500. Bill seconded the motion and motion passed unanimously.

Outreach- Aaron made a motion to create a line item in the Memorial Fund called "Crisis Fund" for local people in need. Requests will be approved by the Council and dispensed accordingly. The motion was also to include moving \$5,000 from the Unspecified category for seed money. Laura Lieffring seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Youth- Council discussed allowing the youth to have more options as to which Bible Camp they could attend and shall get a scholarship. Council will have to discuss with women's group.

Decorating Committee- Neil made a motion to keep the TV on the current wall in the fellowship hall and to have the old screen and projector removed as the technology is now obsolete. Decorating committee will decide where to place Paul Ohman's Painting. Bill seconded the motion and passed.

New Business:

- A. Council to review Job Description of paid employees and discuss next meeting. Neil will meet with Terri to discuss using Google docs to help with committees' communication.
- B. Replace TV in Sanctuary- Neil will get info. on whether it is easier to replace two at the same time. A member of the church offered to purchase a new TV so our cost may only be one if two TVs are purchased.
- C. Hierarchy of Projects and Possible meeting times. This will be discussed at the next meeting. Projects to consider- signage, shed, canopy, bell tower, youth pastor, Sunday school space, and the narthex.




